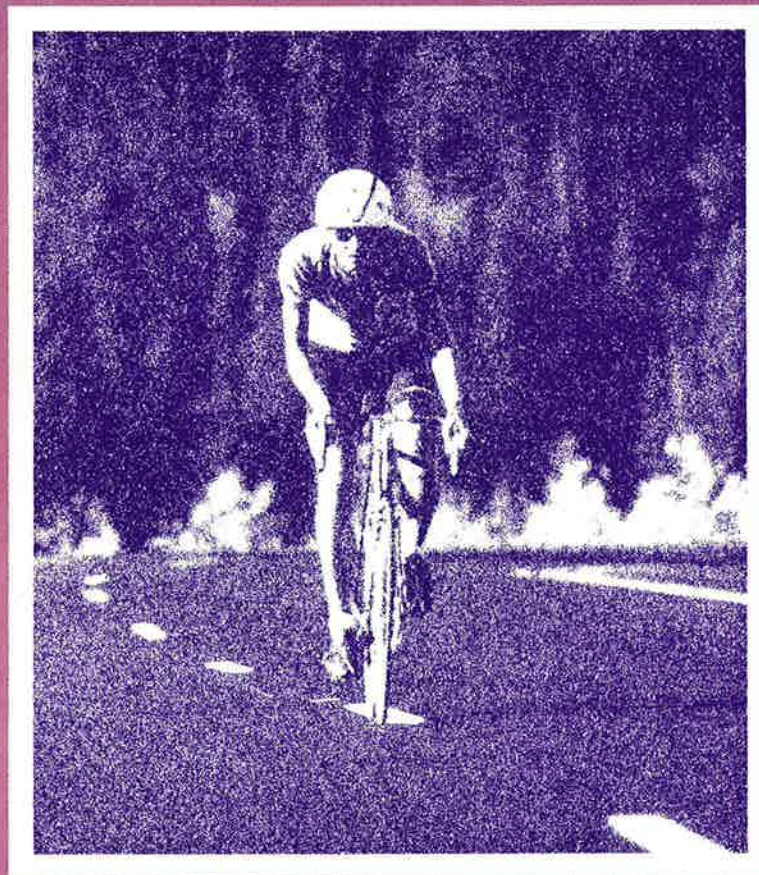

The United States Cycling Federation (USCF) is recognized by the United States Olympic Committee as the national governing body for the sport of cycling. An affiliated member of the International Amateur Cycling Federation and the International Cycling Union, the USCF was organized in 1920 as the Amateur Bicycle League of America. The current name was adopted in 1975.

The USCF, based at Colorado Springs, Colorado, has over 700 member clubs and 19,000 licensed riders competing in over 1,000 USCF - sanctioned events each year.

Membership in the organization has more than doubled since 1980.

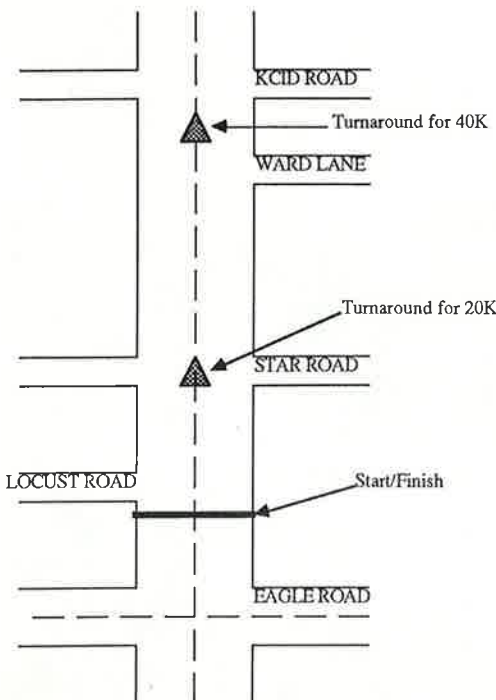

THE BOISE HEADLINERS

The Boise Headliners, Inc., is a non-profit organization dedicated to the promotion of major sports events in Idaho's capital city.

Sponsored by the Boise Convention & Visitors Bureau, the Boise Headliners are promoting their inaugural event July 28 through August 3 --- the 1986 Coca-Cola National Road Cycling Championship. Event co-sponsors are Coca-Cola USA and Boise's Inland Coca-Cola Bottling Company.
