- ENTRIES:** Open to all licensed ABL riders. Women ride with men. Entries close April 25. Post entry fee (\$4.25) charged for late entries. Unattached riders pay double. *SIGNATURE OF PARENT OR LEGAL GUARDIAN REQUIRED FOR ALL RIDERS UNDER 18.*
- COURSE:** Open, marked, 30-mile circuit. Rolling hills. Some short, steep grades. Light traffic.
- RULES:** ABL rules apply. Road bikes only. Freewheel. Two working brakes. Plugged handlebar ends. Helmets. Safety inspection. Race held rain or shine.
- REGISTRATION:** Ramer Hall, Camp Barrett, Quantico Marine Corps Base. 10:30 A.M. (EDT). Riders must present racing license and pay \$1.00 number deposit.

DRIVING INSTRUCTIONS:

Race is held at the Quantico Marine Corps Base, approximately 30 miles South of Washington, D.C. From the interchange in *Virginia* of I-495 and I-95, proceed toward Richmond approximately 20 miles. Exit at the Marine Corps Base/Quantico sign, which is the *next* exit after Route 619 (Triangle/Quantico). At bottom of exit ramp, turn right on Russell Road and follow signs approximately 3 miles to intersection of MCB Road 2 (*sign points to "The Basic School"*). Turn left 2-1/2 miles to Camp Barrett.

FACILITIES:

Showers and rest rooms are available at Ramer Hall. No restaurant facilities. Little shade. No grandstand.

FEEDING:

Allowed at designated areas.

SUPPORT VEHICLES:

Provided by the promoters. Will carry extra equipment and first-aid. No other vehicles will be allowed on the course during the race.

RIDER BULLETINS AND COURSE MAPS:

Available at Ramer Hall at 9:00 (EDT). Route will be marked on road surface.

RULES AND PROCEDURES

1. All ABL rules apply.
2. Only official vehicles on course during races. Spare parts may be sent with official van, which will follow each race, after which it will make an additional trip around the course to pick up riders wishing a ride.
3. Feeding permitted during Senior race only. Feeding area is on last hill before finish line, about 1/2 mile East of Race Headquarters on MCB Road 2. Feeders must walk to area. No cars allowed.
4. Dropped riders may ride the full distance of the race. However, each race will be considered over after sufficient riders have finished to cover the prize list and they will proceed at their own risk.
5. Riders who withdraw from the race must report to the Judge's Stand immediately upon returning to Camp Barrett.
6. Numbers should be turned in at Registration Desks immediately after each race and before going to showers.
7. Showers are available in Ramer Hall. Please finish by 5:00 PM.
8. All persons are requested to avoid littering anywhere on Quantico Marine Corps Base.

NATIONAL CAPITAL OPEN

All riders are reminded that the next major event to be promoted by the National Capital Velo Club will be the NATIONAL CAPITAL OPEN BICYCLE RACE, to be held in Washington, D.C. June 24, 1973. The race will be held in two stages. In the morning there will be a road race over a 3.8 mile hilly course in Rock Creek Park. In the afternoon the traditional Criterium will be held on the Ellipse in front of the White House. This two stage race will equalize competition for participants. The morning event will be a test of hill climbing, descend and cornering ability. The afternoon event is a test of speed and endurance.

By changing the format of the race this year, we are hoping to make it the best race for the competitors that we have ever had. Application is being made to the ABL to identify it as a Sectional B.A.R. event. Entry blanks will be mailed to all participants in the Old Dominion Road Race, all Clubs, and State Representatives about May 15. COURSE INFORMATION

LOCATION

Course is on Quantico Marine Corps Base, approximately 30 miles South of Washington, D.C. From interchange in Virginia of I-495 and I-95, proceed toward Richmond approximately 20 miles. Exit at the Marine Corps Base/Quantico sign, which is the next exit after Route 619 (Triangle/Quantico). At bottom of exit ramp, turn right on Russell Road and follow signs approximately 3 miles to intersection of Marine Corps Base (MCB) Road 2 (sign points to "The Basic School"). Turn left 2-1/2 miles to Camp Barrett.

COURSE DESCRIPTION

All races start and finish on Marine Corps Base (MCB) Road 2 at Camp Barrett. Two circular loops will be used, both ridden clockwise.

- Loop 1: 9 miles. From start/finish line around course bounded by corners 1, 2, 6 and 7.
- Loop 2. 22.5 miles. From start/finish line around course bounded by corners 1 thru 7.

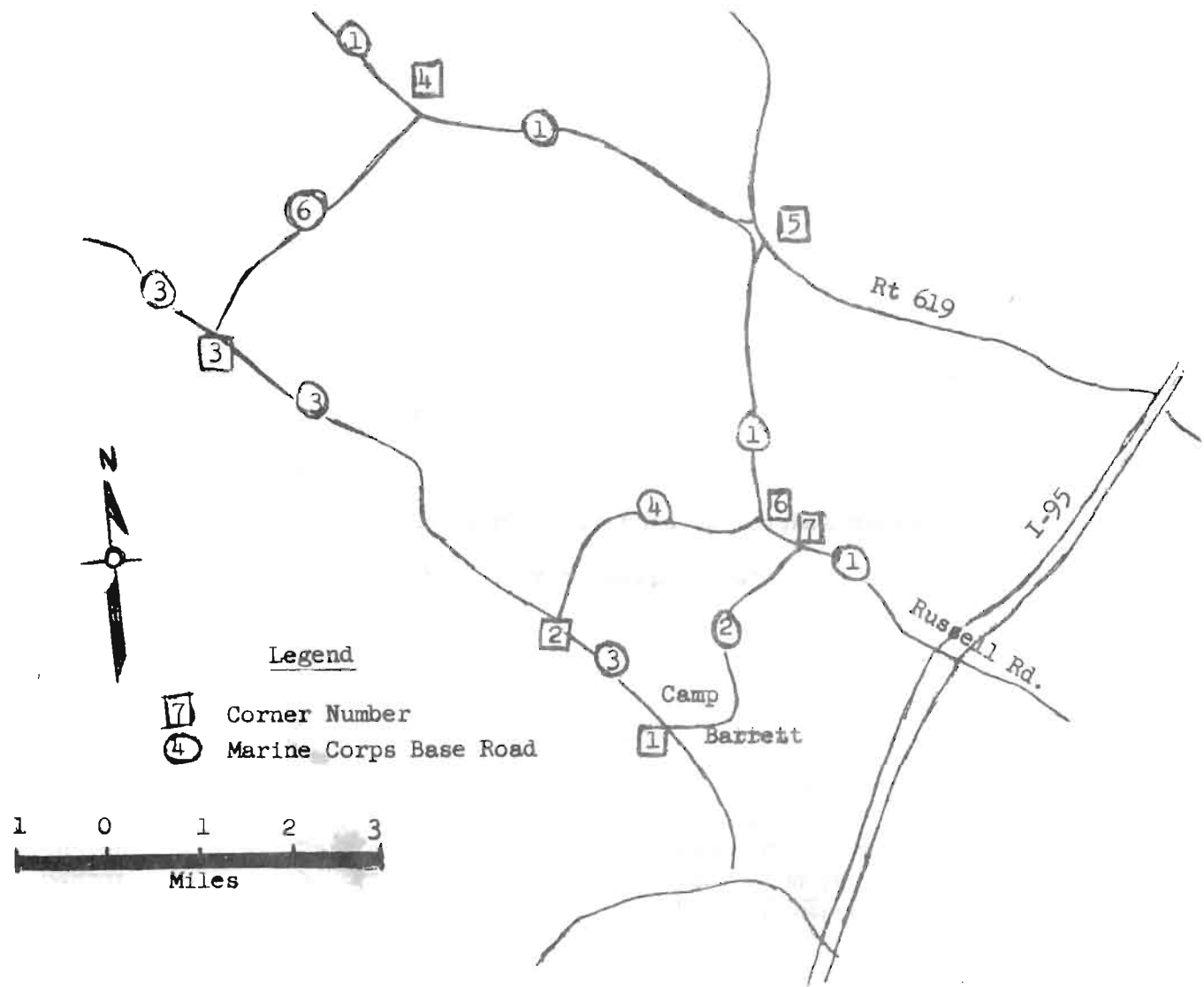
