

Less satisfied, but still smiling was National Veteran Road and Criterium Champion Jim Montgomery. "I hate time trialing, but it's something to do," he said after taking sixth place. "Next time I will use lighter wheels, lighter tires and I'll give it more preparation. It's important to know this course to shift properly."

## Masters and Grand Masters:

Familiarity with the course seemed to be the winning ingredient for Dick Poor, 49, in the Masters event. From nearby Montclair, NJ, he'd ridden the circuit five or six times and planned his gear changes. "I'm not that good on the hills, but I've been training more intensely this year," he said.

At 1:03 flat, Poor was a minute faster than 49-year-old Arnie Uhrlass, who took the silver medal. The winner of the Tour of Somerville in '57, Uhrlass is a former Olympian in both cycling and speed-skating.

Only one second behind Uhrlass, Maryland's Jerry Nugent was third for the second consecutive year. Nugent said a sloppy gear change in the last few miles nearly brought him to a complete stop. "I missed a total of six shifts but that was the worst," he said.

In fourth place was Frank Powell, the Masters national record holder (58:20). The Californian said he wasn't used to the humidity or heat and felt woozy on the final miles. "If I had gone all out, I might have collapsed," he stated. Powell scored a triumph of sorts, however. Runner-up in '80, he edged defending champion Larry Reade by 20 seconds this year. "I've been trying to beat Reade for three or four years, and I finally did it."

Reade said he sprinted for the finish a few miles early thinking that the line was just over the next hill. It wasn't, and he labored home to fifth place in 1:04:29.

Milo Hadlock, 57, of Salt Lake City, UT, took the Grand Masters division in 1:08:04. It was his fourth win in the last five years — he didn't compete in '79 — and his victory margin was more than two minutes. A veteran of 20 years of racing, Hadlock trains in the Uinta mountains where he often climbs to 8,000 feet.

Donald Feder of Fairport, NY, and Pat Patten of Dallas, TX, finally emerged from the shadows of three-time 60-64 age-group winner Barney Richardson. Feder, 63, won the 60-64 division after a bronze last year and a silver in '79. Patten captured the 65-69 crown following two bronzes and a silver in the younger group.

Still talking about his publicity appearance at the Coors Classic, 85-year-old Fred Knoller was the oldest TT contestant and endured the heat and hills to finish in 1:46. While his time was about 15 minutes

off his '80 clocking, Knoller said this year's course was very difficult — more difficult, in fact, than the terrain used for the Veterans' World Cup in Austria, where he competed last year.

## Vet. Women: Judy Layton

Two-time Veteran Women's champion Joyce Sulanke has found a real challenger in Judy Layton, 38, of Tahoe City, CA. Layton began racing last October and in June at the Northern California District Championships she shattered Sulanke's 25-mile record with a 59:49. The national TT was her third 25-miler and she clocked in at 1:07:54, which would have put her in seventh place in the Senior Women's race.

"I shouldn't have been surprised when I first saw this course, but I really was," Layton said, joking that she almost wanted to go home. But by the mid-point, she said, she started to feel good and powered to a 45-second victory over Sulanke.

Layton attended a training camp in Colorado Springs earlier this year, where she climbed with the strongest women riders and reportedly even dropped them once in a while. She and her husband Kim are unquestionably the revelation of U.S. Veteran's racing this season: he was fourth in the TT and went on to win the road race.
